

Breaking down words



A lot of long words can be broken down into smaller parts. For example:



prefix
meaning 'not'

dis-

root: what is left of the word when all the prefixes and suffixes are removed suffix which turns a noun into an adjective

Knowing about the different parts of words can help us to understand their meanings.





What is a prefix?



A prefix is group of letters that goes before the root of a word. The prefix changes the meaning of the word. For example:



Knowing what the prefixes mean can help you to understand and spell unfamiliar words. In this example, the prefixes are:


con = with/together; de = undo; ob = in the way.

Antonym prefixes



Look at prefixes of these words.

What is the effect of the prefix on the meaning of each word?

The prefixes in, im, il, un, and ir all mean 'not'. So by using these prefixes, the meanings of the words change – to the opposite meanings.

These are called **antonym prefixes**. 'Antonym' means 'opposite'.
