

How has the Earth changed?









What is the Earth made out of?



If it was possible to dig to the center of the Earth, what would you find?

You would dig through three sections:

- crust the rocky, outer layer beneath your feet.
- mantle the semi-liquid, very high temperature layer below the crust. The cooler section near to the crust is less mobile than the hotter section next to the core (known as the asthenosphere).
- core the layer at the center of the Earth. This layer is divided into two sections: the liquid, outer core and the solid, inner core.
