
How should you prepare for a group discussion?


Begin by researching the topic you are going to discuss, writing down any relevant data.

As you learn more about the topic, consider what thoughts and opinions you will bring to the discussion. Your comments should be supported by your research.

Listening in a discussion





When participating in a group discussion, it is important to listen carefully to other people's ideas. Your responses should show that you understand the subject and have reflected on what others have said.

You should listen politely to the other members of your group in a discussion. It is essential that you allow people to express their viewpoints and that you do not interrupt them while they are speaking.

In pairs, make a list of ways in which you can show that you are listening in a discussion.

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Speaking in a discussion



In a discussion, you should try to make a positive contribution to the task and avoid affecting the group negatively.



You can do this by:

- showing enthusiasm and speaking with confidence
- participating fully in the discussion.

An important part of group participation is making sure that everyone's ideas are heard and understood.
