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




Context Word parts Reference

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Context clues



Context clues can tell you a lot about a word even without breaking the word into parts or using a dictionary.

"Fame was thrilling only until it became _____."

Gloria Swanson (actress, singer, producer)

What part of speech is the missing word?

Does the missing word have negative or positive connotations?

What word or words in the sentence give you an idea of its meaning?





Using context



"Fame was thrilling only until it became grueling."

- Gloria Swanson (actress, singer, producer)

Based on context clues, can you suggest some words that might fill the blank?

The correct word is "grueling," which means very tiring.

Although you may not have suggested this exact word, your suggestions were probably all adjectives with negative connotations.

Even without knowing the word, you were able to understand its significance and, more importantly, the meaning of the sentence.





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
Word parts



Breaking a word apart can help you figure out what the word means.

Lots of words have Greek or Latin beginnings (prefixes), middles (roots) or endings (suffixes).

For example, the Latin root word "port" means "to carry." What common words include "port"?



Being familiar with Greek and Latin word parts will greatly improve your vocabulary.





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Using prefixes



Looking at word parts can give you important clues about a word's meaning. Match the following Greek and Latin prefixes (word beginnings) to their meanings.

Press the information button next to each prefix to see an example word.

start












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Using dictionaries
